Literacy/Communication:

This half term, our English grammar will focus on the use of commas to avoid ambiguity and words/phrases which bring cohesion across sentences or paragraphs. We will continue our weekly reading comprehension exercises. We are particularly looking forward to developing our knowledge of play scripts as we join with year 6 in rehearsing and performing the end of term play.

Numeracy:

There will be a large focus on maths as we bring our learning together by looking at geometry, converting units from kilometres to metres, centimetres to millimetres etc., time, volume and capacity. There will also be weekly arithmetic and reasoning and problem solving sessions to boost the children's skills and knowledge.

Science:

Our work on forces will continue for the first few weeks as the children increase their ability to carry out tests and record experiments. This will be followed by the topic 'Animals, including humans' which will tie into PSHE as we explore human growth, development and relationships.

To go alongside the exciting camping opportunity at school, we will be bringing our science knowledge into action as we consider the challenge of designing a tent for 21st century living.
