Your children have settled in well to the new half term and are ready for all the learning ahead...


Keep it up Class 6!

Over the next term our themed learning will be centered around the text Shackleton's journey:



The children we will be continuing with Shackleton's journey and exploring what it was like for crew members, through independent research and discussion. They will be putting themselves in the shoes of the crew members and creating diaries. They will also be writing a newspaper article based on the expedition. The class will also explore the habitat of Antarctica.

In class, we will find out what Antarctica is like as a destination. We will be creating fact files, holiday leaflets and exploring what the climate is like in Antarctica.




In R.E, we will be learning about and showing the life of Buddha, through storyboards. We will learn about the origins of Buddhism and the key beliefs.

In Maths, we will be focusing on ratio, measurement and geometry. Problem solving will be a key aspect of our work this half term and the class will be applying all of their knowledge learnt this year to a range of problems.

Our Writing sessions will be focused closely on working on the children's individual targets for writing. We will be writing a range of genres using a variety of stimulus including video clips.

The children will be further developing their reading fluency and comprehension skills through daily reading sessions. We are trying to widen our vocabulary as much as possible by learning many new words, through individual reading, guided reading and while reading our whole class reading book - Skellig.
