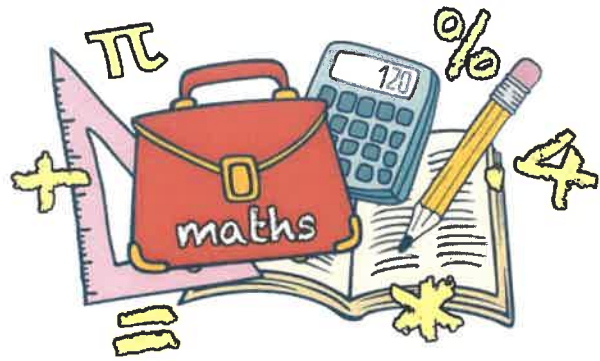

In Maths, we will continue to focus on Year 6 objectives, these will include data handling, drawing line graphs, knowledge of circles and exploring more complex shapes and their properties.
